The Country of Kenya


Kenya is a country right in the armpit of Africa! The country of Kenya is 17 times smaller than the United States, about the size of the state of Texas.

Kenya has many different land features, including Africa's second highest mountain, which is named: Mount Kenya.

Since Kenya is close to the equator, it is very warm.

People in Kenya wear light clothing to help them stay cool in the extreme heat. Wearing light colored T-shirts and pants helps keep the sun off their skin, while the light colors won't absorb as much sun.

There are many different kinds of animals in Kenya! The most popular animals in Kenya are lions, elephants, buffalo, rhinoceros, and leopards.



Other animals include zebras, giraffes, cheetahs, wild dogs, jackals, foxes, hyenas, baboons, monkeys, gazelles, antelopes, wildebeests, hippopotamus, warthogs, aardvarks, otters, rabbits, and squirrels.

Kenya's famous lake is Lake Turkana.

Just east of Lake Turkana is the desolate Chalbi Desert.

Kenya also has a large forest. It is called the Aberdare Forest.

Kenyans have made lots of farms near much of the Aberdare Forest, growing sugar cane, corn, plantains, tea, coffee, flowers, and beans. They also grow many other varieties of fruits and vegetables.




