John 14:18 I will not leave you as orphans

When Jesus died the disciples hid in fear, as though they were orphans. Their lives were aimless, pointless, without meaning and filled with fear. Then Jesus rose. They saw him alive again. An orphan will never see his parents again, but the disciples saw Christ again. And Christ promises that we also will see Him again. Judas asks the question we all want to know, how? Christ makes it clear that it is through His word that we see Him. The world cannot see Him because the world sees only a book. But through faith we hear the voice of God and know that He is alive.
